Joseph Alexander Shea of Perryville died at his home on Friday, Oct. 19, 2012. He was 77.

He was born on July 18, 1935 in Springfield, III., the son of George Edward and Agnes Elizabeth (Mueller) Shea. He was married on May 30, 1959 to Vivian A. Wallace of Perryville, who survives.

Survivors include five daughters and one son, Therese (Mark) Unverferth; Maureen (Jeff) Schroeder; and Kathryn (Randy) Wibbenmeyer, all of Perryville; Louise (Robert) Hayden of Fenton; Rebecca (Raymond) Barreras of Orlando, Fla.; and George (Tanya) Shea of Ballwin.

Mr. Shea was a member of St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church. He graduated from the St. Louis College of pharmacy in 1962 and received a gold certificate for 50 years. He served in the United States Army and Commemorative air force. He was a member of Boy Scout troop No. 155 and 250 and spent 62 years in scouting. He was also a member of American Legion, Knights of Columbus 4th degree and past faithful navigator, member of S.N.A.G. organization. He loved to hunt, fish and was an avid airplane enthusiast. He loved being with his family, children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents, five sisters, four brothers, one nephew and two granddaughters.
