SHADETREE 2015



She received bachelor degrees in Journalism and English from the University of Georgia, Athens, and a master's degree in Special Education from Purdue University. Her marriage was to Melvin R. 
Last time I sent this out only about 25% of members responded with updated information. I would like to have an updated roster on the website & Facebook page by mid-March.
